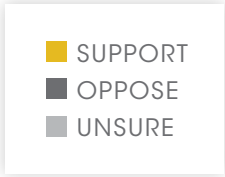

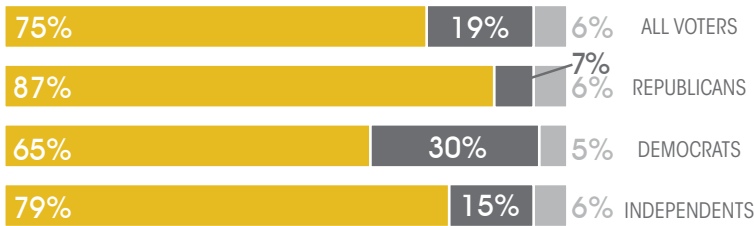

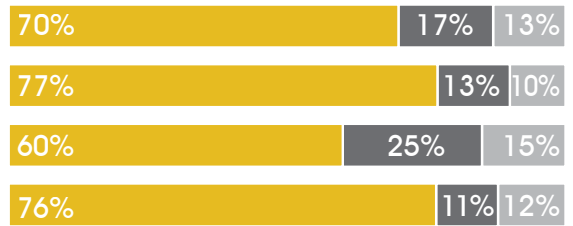
Work Requirements for Food Stamps

Voters support requiring able-bodied, working-age adults to work or participate in a job training program at least part-time in order to receive food stamps.



Eliminating Waiver Loopholes

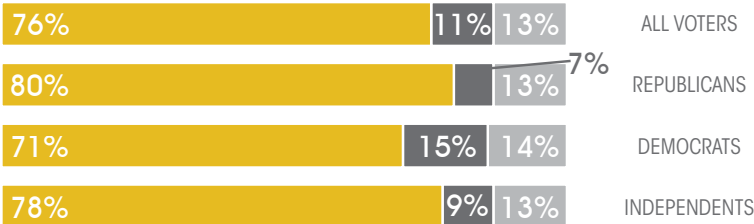
Voters believe states should only waive work requirements in counties with unemployment rates above 10 percent.



WELFARE INTEGRITY

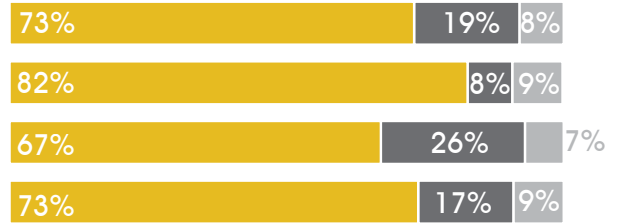
Child Support Cooperation

Voters support requiring single parents on food stamps to cooperate with state child support enforcement efforts.



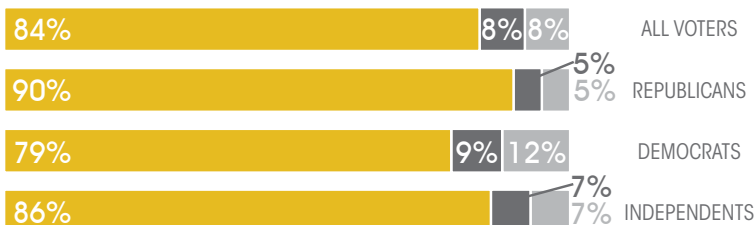
Asset Testing

Stopping Fraud

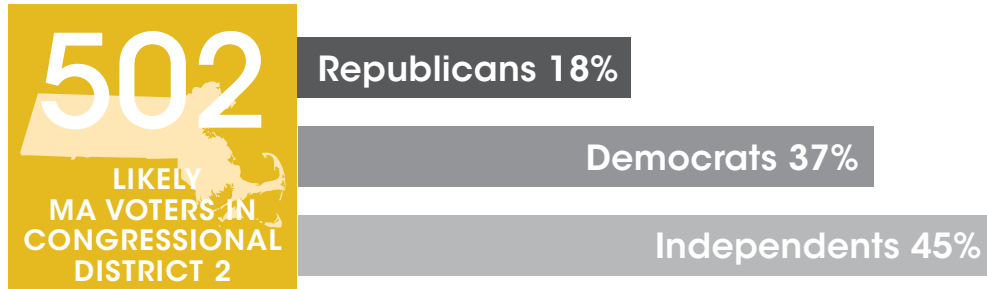
Voters want states to share data on food stamp recipients to ensure people are not collecting benefits in multiple states simultaneously.



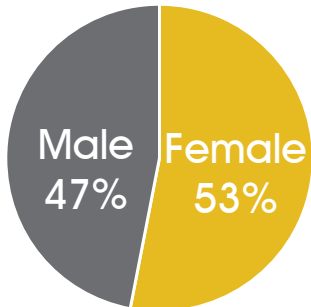
Limiting Card Replacements

Voters support efforts to combat fraud that limit the number of times an individual can request a replacement EBT card without review to cut back on the sale or trade of EBT cards.

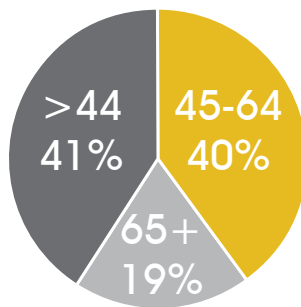




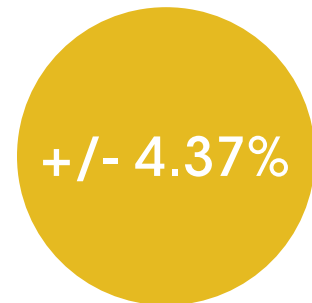

MARGIN OF ERROR



Results for this poll are based on automated telephone interviews conducted among a sample of 502 likely voters in Massachusetts' 2nd congressional district. Data for this survey research was collected by Cor Strategies Inc. The surveys were conducted April 14-17, 2018.

The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4.37 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for certain subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data was sampled using weighted demographic information from state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections were used to construct sample target weights.
