



FLORIDIANS WANT COMMONSENSE Health Care Reforms



Voters **support requiring doctors, hospitals, and labs to provide detailed out-of-pocket cost information** to patients at least 72 hours ahead of time for non-emergencies.

Voters **support requiring all private insurers to cover out-of-network doctors so long as they have below-average costs**, allowing people to keep their doctors even if they switched insurance providers.

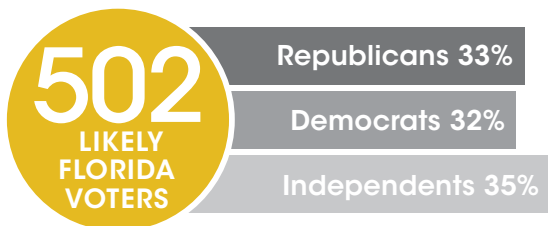

Results for this poll are based on live and automated telephone interviews conducted among a statewide sample of 502 likely voters in Florida. Data for this survey research was collected by Cor Strategies Inc. The surveys were conducted December 3-6, 2019.

The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4.37 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for certain subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data was sampled using weighted demographic information from state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections were used to construct sample target weights.
