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Senior Democrats have suggested that should Trump’s nominee for the Supreme Court be confirmed by the Senate and Biden subsequently wins the election, they will engage in court packing, a procedure by which new Supreme Court seats are created and justices confirmed in order to change the ideological makeup of the court. The Affordable Care Act, otherwise known as ObamaCare, has an individual mandate which requires everyone to have health insurance. In 2012, the Supreme Court ruled that the mandate was only legal because it was a tax on not having health insurance. Do you support or oppose the individual mandate?

Unsure	12%	12%	12%	11%

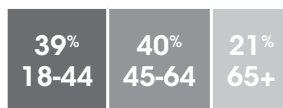

Unsure	16%	12%	24%	10%

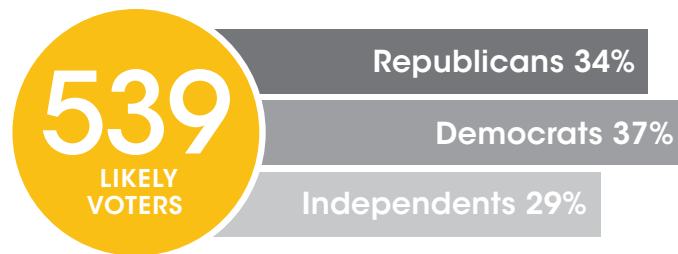
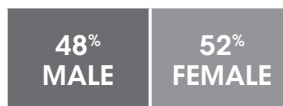
# OSP Voters Oppose Court-Packing

Results for this poll are based on automated telephone interviews conducted among a nationwide sample of 539 likely voters. Data for this survey research was collected by Cor Strategies Inc. The surveys were conducted September 22-25, 2020.

The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4.22 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for certain subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data was sampled using weighted demographic information from state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections were used to construct sample target weights.
