Traditionally, absentee voting has been reserved for voters who are members of the military, those who are traveling, and individuals with health conditions that prevent them from going to the polls. But, Georgia has adopted no-excuse absentee voting that allows anyone to request an absentee ballot for any reason. Would you support or oppose requiring voters to have a valid legal reason for requesting an absentee ballot?</b></p>

<p><b>2. Georgia law requires individuals voting in person to present identification to prove they are who they say they are. However, Georgia does not require any proof of identification from individuals who are voting by mail. 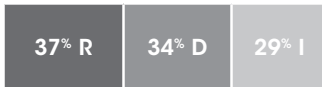

Results for this poll are based on automated telephone interviews conducted among a statewide sample of 502 likely Georgia voters. Data for this survey research was collected by Cor Services, Inc. The surveys were conducted February 22-25, 2021.

The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4.37 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for certain subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data was sampled using weighted demographic information from state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections were used to construct sample target weights.
